EUROSLAM

For several months we have watched the news clips of refugees escaping the civil war in Syria and from radical Islamists in West Africa. Little reporting has been provided on their assimilation, especially in Germany.

What is occurring in Germany does not bode well should the Obama Administration decide to open the floodgates into the U.S. The migrants in Germany are using a variety of tactics to force German authorities to comply with an ever growing list of demands. Hunger strikes, lawsuits and threats of violence are regularly undertaken by Muslims.

The Germans have been quite hospitable to these asylum seekers. They have provided shelter, three hot meals a day, as well as free healthcare. But no good deed goes unpunished, as now the migrants are demanding more money, more comfortable beds, more hot water, more privacy, more ethnic food, more recreational facilities and their own homes.

One Syrian family made an appointment to see a rental property but refused to view the house because the real estate agent was female. Per the agent, “they were not interested in viewing the property because I am a woman, I am blonde and because I looked the men into their eyes.” This was inappropriate according to the Syrian male who told the agent that her company should have sent a male to show the property.

Muslim men’s views towards women are in full display across the German landscape. In Idar-Oberstein, an imam refused to shake the hand of the visiting chairwoman of the Christian Democratic Union because she was a woman. A female at the supermarket checkout line had a Muslim male jump in front of her with the comment: “I man. You woman. I go first.” Polls show that a majority of Muslims living in Europe want the application of sharia law and clearly reject any idea of assimilation.

The Munich Chamber of Trade reported that 70% of the migrants from Iraq and Syria, who have been offered apprenticeships, failed to complete them. According to the director, many young migrants believe apprenticeship is beneath them.

The mass influx of migrants is placing a significant strain on the German healthcare system. Diseases are reappearing that have not been in Germany for years. Many migrant children have not been immunized and now some German parents are concerned there may not be enough vaccine to immunize their own children.

Public health officials are closely watching for diphtheria, Ebola, hepatitis, HIV/AIDS, malaria, measles, meningitis, mumps, polio, scabies, tetanus, tuberculosis, typhus and whooping cough. They are on high alert for mass outbreaks of influenza and Norovirus.

Per German health officials, 15% of newly arriving migrants require immediate medical treatment. This means that approximately 250,000 require immediate care. Adding to this problem, Muslim women refuse to be treated by male doctors and many Muslim men refuse to take treatment from women.

Bavarian lawmakers say that German Muslim population will nearly quadruple to 20 million within the next five years. In a leaked document from German intelligence, “integration of hundreds of thousands of illegal migrants will be impossible given the large number involved and the already existing Muslim parallel societies in Germany.”

The intelligence document went on to say: “We are importing Islamic extremism, Arab anti-Semitism, national and ethnic conflicts of other peoples, as well as a different understanding of society and law. German security agencies are unable to deal with these imported security problems, and the resulting reaction from the German population.”

Obama’s lack of foreign policy towards Syria even caused the Washington Post to become a critic. The Post’s Editorial page editor took issue with the President: “This may be the most surprising of President Obama’s foreign-policy legacies: not just that he presided over a humanitarian and cultural disaster of epochal proportions, but that he soothed the American people into feeling no responsibility for the tragedy.”

The editor went on to say: “One reason is that Obama — who ran for president on the promise of restoring the United States’ moral stature — has constantly reassured Americans that doing nothing is the smart and moral policy. He has argued, at times, that there was nothing the United States could do, belittling the Syrian opposition as “former doctors, farmers, pharmacists and so forth.”

“When he announced in August 2011 that “the time has come for President Assad to step aside,” critics worried the words might prove empty — but few imagined the extent of the catastrophe: not just the savagery of chemical weapons and “barrel bombs,” but also the Islamic State’s recruitment of thousands of foreign fighters, its spread from Libya to Afghanistan, the danger to the U.S. homeland that has alarmed U.S. intelligence officials, the refugees destabilizing Europe.” But don’t worry Washington Post, climate change is the country’s biggest problem...
