## Don't Weep for American Jihadis **President Fran Cavenaugh**

**W**hen our Navy SEALS killed Osama bin Laden, there were murmurs of protest from some who thought his killing amounted to an assassination and from others who thought he should have been arrested instead and brought to trial. This thinking was not widespread. But now comes the killing of Anwar al-Awlaki, an American citizen who had joined the enemy.

The voices of protest are suddenly louder and more diverse, ranging from the ACLU on the liberal left to presidential hopeful Ron Paul on the libertarian right. The general line of reasoning is that, as a U.S. citizen, Awlaki was entitled to due process and should have been brought to trial rather than killed. Leaving aside the point that arresting Awlaki was probably an impossibility, let's consider whether his killing violated his Constitutional rights or not..


Our analysis is facilitated because there is historical precedent to guide us. At the outset of our own Civil War, President Lincoln confronted this very issue. John Yoo says "Lincoln concluded the laws of war must allow the United States to treat its own citizens as enemies when they take up arms in rebellion". And the Union forces killed them in combat----no warrants, no arrests, no trials. Imagine the absurdity of the position that the Union forces would have had to arrest the Confederates on the battlefield and bring them to trial. But such is the position of those who say the killing of Awlaki was a violation his Constitutional rights.

In addition to this historical precedence, there is judicial support for outright killing rather than arresting Americans who join with enemy forces. The ACLU actually sued the Obama administration in 2010, claiming that attempting to kill Awlaki violated his right to due process. (Never mind that if he had wanted due process

he could have hopped a flight to the land of his birth and presented himself for trial.) The federal court, in a moment of clarity, ruled in favor of the Government.

A recent New York Times article (Secret memo OK'd killing, by Charlie Savage, October 8, 2011) describes the detailed legal analysis the Obama administration conducted. They concluded that an American citizen playing an operational role in support of enemy forces was a lawful target. Their analysis included whether killing Awlaki could constitute murder or assassination and whether it would violate his right to due process. It seems like a no-brainer but, thankfully, the Obama administration got this one right.

Awlaki won't be the last; there will be other American citizens who will join with the enemy. If they give themselves up or are otherwise captured, and if they have committed specific crimes, they can be tried in federal court (as were John Walker Lindh and Jose Padilla) or before a military tribunal. Or, as POWs they can be held until the end of the war. But if they remain at large and involved in the jihad against us, they may be targeted and killed. Historical precedent says so and the courts say so---the ACLU and Ron Paul notwithstanding.
