Julie Mobley is running for State Senate District 7, covering Walnut Creek, Livermore and nearby parts of Contra Costa and Alameda Counties. Growing up in Silicon Valley, Mobley witnessed first-hand the area's rapid growth into the tech hub giant it is today. Being exposed to this culture of math, technology and science from a young age inspired her to study engineering at the University of California, Berkeley, where she earned her B.S. in Chemical Engineering in 1990.

After graduation, Mobley moved to Cincinnati, Ohio and began a career with Procter & Gamble as an engineer designing consumer products in Research and Development. She will challenge the state legislature to achieve better results with a Strategic Plan for California, updating our infrastructure from outdated transportation and power models to systems that are reliable, safe, clean, efficient and more affordable; improving services while reducing costs for housing, healthcare, education, energy, water and transportation; and investing in new technologies and innovative approaches to address extreme fire risks in our state.

Nisha Sharma expresses a debt of gratitude to the United States and the East Bay for providing her with the American Dream, after having emigrated from India. WAITING PERIODS

MYTH: HANDGUN WAITING PERIODS REDUCE HOMICIDES AND SUICIDES.

Fact: "There appears to be no consistent statistically significant relationship between handgun delay policies and homicides . . . Handgun delay policies do have a consistently negative and statistically significant effect on firearm related suicides." So, increasing the time to get a handgun does not reduce homicides but it does reduce suicides.
