

SECOND AMENDMENT MYTHS

Myth: Passing various laws to restrict and otherwise control retail gun sales are needed to reduce the level of gun violence in inner cities.

Fact: Restricting retail gun sales will have no effect on the largest portion of gun violence in the inner cities.

A recent study (Swaner, R, White, E., Martinez, A, Camacho, A. Spate, B, Alexander, J., Webb, L. and Evans, K. Gotta Make Your Own Heaven: Guns, safety and the edge of adulthood in New York City. August, 2020, Center for Court Innovation. www.courtinnovation.org. totally debunked this myth. This study interviewed 330 inner city youth.

Here is a representative small sample of some of the findings for the 16-24 age group:

- 87%: Have owned or carried a gun
- 68%: Carry guns in public, 51% at parties or social events
- 58%: Easy to get a gun if needed (from local networks)
- 91%: Believe gangs provide protection for their members
- 63%: Acquired first gun at age 14–17 (20% under age 14)
- 77%: Carry guns for safety, 52% feel less likely to be a victim
- 93%: Gangs provide material and emotional support
- 78%: Reside in public housing
- 32%: Earn money through illicit jobs
- 20%: Their illicit jobs “require” them to carry guns
- 88%: Have arrest records
- 38%: Have gun charges against them
- 57%: First arrest before age 16

The endless stream of new gun laws would have no effect on the above FACTS.
